Show and Sale Details

- Set up is on Friday, March 4th, from 10am to 5pm
- Ribbon judging begins on Saturday, March 5th, at 9:30am.
- AOS judging begins on Saturday, March 5th, at 10:30am, after ribbon judging.
- Saturday show and sale hours: 9am to 5pm (show open at 11 a.m., but sales can begin at 9 a.m.)
- Sunday show and sale hours: 9am to 4pm (sales can last until all customers have been served)
- Tear down begins at 4pm on Sunday, March 6^h, and area must be clear by 5pm if possible.

Exhibition Rules

1. The MBOS Show Committee has complete authority over all show and sales areas.
2. This is an open show. Anyone who wishes may exhibit in accordance with these Exhibition Rules. Exhibition space must be reserved and arranged for in advance.
3. Placing an entry or display in the show shall constitute agreement to abide by the rules contained herein.
4. Displays are required of all commercial vendors; individual growers and societies are encouraged to display. Combined entries for single exhibits must be requested on a single application and be pre-approved by the Show Committee.
 - 4.a) All displays will be on the tables provided. Please contact the show chair if you have questions.
 - 4.b) Please have a sign identifying the display's creator (vendor name, society, or organization) for your display after judging is completed.
 - 4.c) To qualify as a display (vendors), a minimum of eight (8) good quality blooming orchids must be included. The display must show some effort at artistic composition, and all plants must be labeled with their name.
 - 4.d) Individual exhibitors who are not associated with a society may contact the show committee, and we will arrange for a suitable accommodation to display your plants.
5. Blooming plants and cut orchids may be entered in the show. While cut flowers are allowed in displays, the majority of the flowers shall be blooming plants. No artificial plants or flowers will be allowed unless classified as artwork and approved by the Show Committee. Foliage plants may be used in exhibits but the only flowers allowed are orchids.
6. Ribbon judging will be conducted by teams of MBOS members assisted by AOS judges on Saturday, March 5.
7. AOS judging will be conducted in accordance with current AOS rules and standards. The exhibitor will be responsible for any fees assessed for awarded plants. Any plant in the show area, whether registered or not, will be considered for AOS judging unless labeled "not for AOS judging." Inflorescences that have been previously screened cannot be entered for AOS judging and must be labeled accordingly.

8. You may register your plants and artwork electronically in advance of the show. If this is not possible, use the handwritten entry form included with the separate instructions. Entry tags with plant numbers will be printed at the show.
9. All show entries must be received by Friday, March 4th, at 4pm
10. Plants must be clean and free of pests and diseases. Any plants with pests or diseases will be refused entry to the show or be removed from the display.
11. All displays must remain intact until the closing of the show at 4pm, Sunday, March 6.
12. Plants and display materials must be removed by 5pm on Sunday, March 6.
13. The MBOS will exercise reasonable precautions in the care of the exhibits but assumes no responsibility for loss or damage. Christianson's Nursery assumes no liability for loss or damage.

Sales Rules

1. All show/sales space is by invitation only. The Show Committee determines which vendors are invited and how much space (display and sale) is granted.
2. Sales materials are limited to orchid plants, orchid growing supplies, and other orchid-related materials.
3. Vendor staffing. Vendors should staff their tables during the sale. Arrangements for Society assistance with staffing may be made with the Show Committee during setup.
4. Society member sales. Society members who display plants may sell orchid plants, orchid growing supplies, and other orchid-related materials. This will include members of visiting societies.
5. All sales will be performed by the Mt Baker Orchid Society, and the following rules apply:
 - The item for sale must have a price tag clearly indicated, which has the seller's name, and can be easily removed from the item. If more than one conflicting price is found on the item, it will not be sold without the express permission of the vendor/owner.
 - The Society will be responsible for collecting and paying sales tax, and will cover all bank costs (credit card or check cashing fees).
 - After deducting a 15% commission from the pre-tax sales amount, the Society will pay the seller the remainder of the sales due within 10 business days of the end of the show.
6. Display requirements. Each orchid vendor must participate in the show exhibition in accordance with the Exhibition Rules. A \$50.00 fee may be paid in lieu of entering a display.

EXHIBITORS

Division A: Beginner - those who have been growing for less than 5 years.

Division B: Experienced growers who have been growing more than 5 years and Commercial growers who sell orchids as a major source of livelihood or who has purchased plants with the intent of reselling them for a profit.

PLANT ENTRY CLASSES

CYPRIPEDIUM ALLIANCE

1. *Paphiopedilum* hybrids, primary or near primary, except as below
2. *Paphiopedilum* hybrids, Maudiae-type (green and white only)
3. *Paphiopedilum* hybrids, Maudiae-type coloratum and vinicolor
4. *Paphiopedilum* complex hybrids, white or near white
5. *Paphiopedilum* complex hybrids, green and/or yellow, other than Maudiae type
6. *Paphiopedilum* complex hybrids, red, rose or mahogany, other than Maudiae type
7. *Paphiopedilum* complex hybrids, other colors, other than Maudiae type
8. *Paphiopedilum* species and hybrids, multiflowered or sequential
9. *Paphiopedilum* species, Brachypetalum and Parvisepalum. Sections (*armeniaceum*, *bellatulum*, etc.)
10. *Paphiopedilum* species, mottled leaf (other than Brachypetalum and Parvisepalum species)
11. *Paphiopedilum* species, solid green leaf, other than multiflowered
12. *Phragmipedium*, *Cypripedium* and *Selenipedium* hybrids
13. *Phragmipedium*, *Cypripedium* and *Selenipedium* species

PLEUROTHALLID ALLIANCE

14. *Masdevallia* species and hybrids, coccinea group (*veitchiana*, *amabilis*, etc.)
15. *Masdevallia* species and hybrids (other than above)
16. Other genera, species and hybrids including intergenerics (*Dracula*, *Pleurothallis*, *Lepanthes*, etc.)

CATTLEYA ALLIANCE

17. Hybrids, miniature (under 10 inches from base of plant to tip of leaf)
18. Hybrids with *Cattleya*, white and semi-alba
19. Hybrids with *Cattleya*, lavender, pink, purple or blue
20. Hybrids with *Cattleya*, yellow, green or bronze
21. Hybrids with *Cattleya*, red, orange
22. Hybrids with *Cattleya*, other (including splash petal)
23. Hybrids without *Cattleya*
24. Species, *Cattleya* Alliance, Large Flowered, over 4 inches
25. Species, *Cattleya* Alliance, Small Flowered, under 4 inches

DENDROBIUM

26. *Dendrobium* Species and Hybrids, Miniature, under 6 inches, excluding inflorescence.
27. *Dendrobium* Species
28. *Dendrobium* Hybrids
29. *Bulbophyllum* and other related genera (*Epigeneum*, *Cadetia*, *Cirrhopetalum*, *Megaclinum*, etc.) Species and Hybrids

PHALAENOPSIS / VANDA ALLIANCE

30. *Phalaenopsis* species (including *Doritis*)
31. *Phalaenopsis* hybrid, white or white with colored lip, may have pink blush
32. *Phalaenopsis* hybrid, striped, any background color
33. *Phalaenopsis* hybrid, pink, lavender or reddish purple
34. *Phalaenopsis* hybrid, Harlequin type, large dark purple spots, any background color
35. *Phalaenopsis* hybrid, spotted or barred, any background color, except class 31 and 32
36. *Phalaenopsis* hybrid, yellow or green with or without markings
37. *Phalaenopsis* hybrid, all other patterns and colors including red, orange, and novelty

- 38. *Phalaenopsis* hybrid, multifloral miniatures, all colors, flowers under 7cm
- 39. Vandaceous species (other than *Phalaenopsis* or *Doritis*)
- 40. Vandaceous hybrids, (including intergeneric other than above)
- 41. Angraecoid Species and hybrids (including *Aerangis*, *Aeranthes*, *Jumellea*, etc.)

CYMBIDIUM

- 42. *Cymbidium* Standard hybrids
- 43. *Cymbidium* hybrids, Miniature or polymin
- 44. *Cymbidium* Species

ONCIDIUM ALLIANCE (Ignoring the latest changes in taxonomy)

- 45. *Brassia* species and hybrids
- 46. Intergenerics with *Brassia* (*Mtssa*, *Brsdm*, *McInra*, *Bllra*, *Dgmra*, *Odbrs*, etc.)
- 47. *Milioniopsis* species
- 48. *Milioniopsis*, waterfalls of any color
- 49. *Milioniopsis*, red or mostly red
- 50. *Milioniopsis*, other color
- 51. *Milonia* species and hybrids (including intergenerics)
- 52. *Odontoglossum* species and hybrids, classic crispum type (*O. alexandrae*, *O. nobile*, *cirrhosum*, *hallii*, *cristatum*, *cruentum*, *epidendroides*, *gloriosum*, *pescatorei* ...) May include intergenerics with *Cochlioda*, *Oncidium*
- 53. *Oncidium* species and hybrids (*Oncidium* only)
- 54. *Oncidium alliance species and intra-generic hybrids, other than above*
- 55. *Oncidium* alliance intergeneric hybrids
- 56. *Tolumnia* (syn *Oncidium*) species and hybrids

MISCELLANEOUS

- 57. (blank)
- 58. *Maxillaria* Alliance Species and hybrids with flowers 4 inches or OVER
- 59. *Maxillaria* Alliance Species and hybrids with flowers UNDER 4 inches
- 60. *Catasetum* alliance species and hybrids (including *Clowesia*, *Cycnoches*, *Galeandra*, *Mormodes*, etc.)
- 61. *Stanhopea* alliance species and hybrids (including *Acneta*, *Coryanthes*, *Gongora*, *Sievekingia*, etc.)
- 62. Other species not listed
- 63. Other hybrids not listed

Special classes (may be entered in multiple classes, use checkbox on entry sheet)

- 64. Natural species
- 65. All genera grown for beauty of foliage, need not be in bloom
- 66. Miniature: plant under 6 inches, excluding inflorescence
- 67. Mounted plants
- 68. Grown on a windowsill
- 69. First Bloom Seedling (no mericlones)
